### My Immersion

The first words I heard, in the country that would be my home for the next two weeks, were, "Pasaporte, por favor!" I decided to better equip myself, for the growing ministry at South Richmond Center, by experiencing the country, the people, and the language of Guatemala through a Spanish immersion with Máximo Nivel, in Antigua, Guatemala.

My flight down to Central America for the two-week intense language training began with a hiccup prior to the actual immersion. After an unexpected night in Houston, I finally arrived in Guatemala, a day late to start this adventure. My host family was accommodating and gracious. There were six other immersion students there and soon I was given a brief orientation of the house. In the course of the two weeks, I didn't master how to get the shower's warm water just right, so many mornings, I settled for the cold showers. After a delicious breakfast prepared by the host mother, I set off for my mile walk to Máximo Nivel school,

orientation and first day of class. During orientation, I was given a placement test, in which I already knew my skill level, having no prior Spanish education, unlike many that were in the program. To my surprise, I was placed in an advanced basic class, in which I struggled that first week.

The class schedule set for me was: four hours of classroom group instruction, and then 2 hours of one-on-one training. In each class, the complete lectures, discussions, and instructions were fully communicated in Spanish. Although I sometimes did not understand most of the lesson, I was able to catch up while doing homework, from extensive notetaking. In the school, there were students from all over United States as well as the world. In my classroom group, some were from Great Britain, New Zealand, and the Netherlands. One sixteen-year-old young man came from California

with his mother and grandmother. This family were all studying and improving their Spanish, through the Máximo Nivel program. Although I was among the oldest participating in the Spanish immersion that week, the young people were kind and helpful when needed. On more than one occasion I was complimented for taking on this endeavor at my age. I took the comments as compliments. The teachers, all local and from the city of Antigua, were friendly but kept to the

rule of Spanish 100% of the time while teaching.

#### My Immersion (continued)

The school also taught English to local students, in which a good estimate would be about two hundred students in the last two months. My days started at 8:00 am and ended at 4:00pm. When finished, I would walk back to my host family's home to study and, of course, struggle to complete my daily homework assignments. At the school, there is a travel company to assist with extra-curricular activities, like Salsa dancing and cooking classes, as well as traveling to the nearby towns, even hiking up mountains and volcanoes. Classes were conducted during the week and the weekends were open to rest, study and take in some local activities.

The immersion experience was intense and, on a few occasions, while trying to do my classroom assignments, I questioned my own sanity. By day ten, my Spanish pronunciation and understanding were getting better, but I was overwhelmed. I knew before going that I would not become fluent on the first trip and expected that I would



be able to speak Spanish well and become more comfortable with common phrases, vocabulary, and sentence structure. Each morning I practiced my Spanish by speaking to all who I encountered. One such instance, which became a habit, was with a lady, on the cleaning staff with whom I would sit for a moment over coffee and talk. On my last day, she came by my class and shared with my instructor that she was thankful for my kindness each day and she wished me a safe trip home. Her gesture and kindness were humbling and seemed to impress my instructor as well. I look forward to returning to study again. I am hopeful that this experience and what I learned will be a help to the many new residents here in South Richmond. We have a growing Latino population, and their presence will guide our Center's "Macedonian call," and that call for ministry. The example of the Apostle Paul is recorded in the Book of Acts: "And a vision appeared to Paul in the night; There stood a man of Macedonia, and prayed him, saying, Come over into Macedonia, and help us. And after he had seen the vision, immediately we endeavored to go into Macedonia, assuredly gathering that the Lord had called us for to preach the gospel unto them." ---- Acts 16:9-10 (KJV).


