God Held Back the Rain

The Bethlehem Baptist Men's Fellowship and the Jannie Jennings Church School Class were willing and ready to join in with The Well to have a Community Fun Day combined with a Clothes Give Away. The men passed out hundreds of flyers and people were in a ready-set-go position to start cleaning out their closets. The excitement was building as the day slowly approached. However, we all were concerned that the event would be rained out because the ten-day forecast predicted rain for that Saturday.

Each day and night, we watched the weather forecast. By the fifth day, the chance of rain began to decrease. Hope was building and finalizing our plans to proceed with the event were made. The Thursday forecast before Saturday's event was very promising. The ready-set-go people could not wait any longer and brought me bags of clothes, boxes of clothes, clothes on hangers, clothes with tags still attached, clothes golden in color from years of being in an attic or basement and of course, along with the clothes, they also brought their shoes. Thank God that the day finally arrived

with only partly cloudy skies, and we rejoiced that God held back the rain. Due to the numerous orders for bounce houses for that Saturday, several men had to be at church by seven o'clock to receive the delivery. A couple of hours later, the volunteers began to show to set up for the day. Tables were lined up on the sidewalk in front of the Bethlehem Fairmount location, food and games were placed in the parking lot. The men were the overseers of the parking lot, and the women took great care of filling the tables with clothes, shoes, pocketbooks, etc.

Within a short period of time, people walking along and those driving by stopped to participate in the event. The tables were emptied and constantly restocked from the abundance of donations received. The tables were filled with men's, women's and children's clothes, but disappeared quickly. I heard one young lady say, "These are some nice things." Another woman who overheard her remarks, replied, "Mrs. Ford always have nice things. She doesn't give out any old thing." Tracts, Daily Bread, and The Well's flyers were distributed to as many that wanted one.

Music, talking, laughter, squeals of joy, smells of cooking hot dogs and hamburgers filled the air. Many were served with clothes and food. The Bounce House and the bean bag toss were the most popular games, but the food reigned supreme overall. At the end of the event, the volunteers had backaches and sore feet, but smiles were on their faces. So many of them were saying the same thing, "This has been a good day and God Held Back the Rain." Of all The Well's past events, this one was the best.


