Early in 2022, I along with the Oregon Hill Center Support Team, which is made up of several people from various RCFN churches as well as the Oregon Hill neighborhood, began to dream of being able to offer free haircuts to the RVA homeless community. We felt this would be not only a self-esteem booster, but a confidence builder for those

seeking jobs, housing, etc. I wrote about this dream in an article titled DREAM ON! In the April 2022 Transformed. First, we began to search to see if there were others offering this service around the city. Jo Ellen Schneider, administrative assistant at the RCFN office, discovered that about a month earlier a non-profit organization called Nurturing Minds had partnered with TruFades Haircuts and Beards

In unnecessarily duplicate services, I called Ticeses Teasley, the founder and director of Nurturing Minds, to discuss their haircutting service and how the Oregon Hill Center might join the partnership. She shared how it was meeting a great need, but that it had recently been discontinued due to a change in her organization's programming and a need for more space. Ms. Teasley then connected me with the co-owner and master barber at TruFades, Mr. Perry Lee.

As Mr. Lee and I spoke the excitement grew as we realized a new partnership was about to emerge! Mr. Lee shared with me

how it all began. "TruFades had begun an apprenticeship program to help aspiring barbers develop the skills they need for a better future.

# CELEBRATE WITH BETHLEHEM BAPTIST PENICK ROAD!

In 1828, nine people organized a Sunday school in a log schoolhouse, five miles from the Richmond City limits. Students from the Virginia Baptist Seminary, now the University of Richmond, helped it become the Bethlehem Baptist Church. The church received its charter on May 31, 1838 and built a new structure in 1839. It reportedly served as a first aid station during the Civil War, burned about 1870 and was rebuilt. A brick Gothic-style church opened on July 25, 1909. On November 3, 1920, this structure burned. Members dedicated the present building on November 6, 1921.
