

#### **RCFN CHURCHES CELEBRATE BLACK HISTORY MONTH** A Conversation on Racial Healing

River Road Church Baptist will be hosting <u>Rev. Dr. Lance Watson</u>, Senior Pastor of the Saint Paul's Baptist Church of Richmond, Virginia and The Rev. Ben Campbell, Pastoral Associate at St. Paul's Episcopal Church of Richmond, Virginia at their next their next Distinguished Speaker's Forum.

Rev. Campbell is an Episcopal priest serving as Pastoral Associate at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in downtown Richmond. He is also the Founder of Richmond Hill;, a residential Christian community and spiritual retreat in Richmond's Church Hill neighborhood. Rev. Campbell is a Civil Rights Activist and Author of *Richmond's Unhealed History*. They will also be joined by <u>Kristen Green</u>, author of *The Devil's Half Acre*. This panel discussion will be held in the Sanctuary. This event is open to the public. While tickets are free of charge, you may offer a suggested donation of \$10. Free parking is available across River Road and behind the church.

#### A Challenge to Our City

Please join Rev. Jim Somerville and David Bailey (pictured left) on March 4th at First Baptist Richmond for this year's choice for the FBC city-wide book read. The selection is *The Fire Next Time* by James Baldwin, written as a letter to his nephew on the 100th anniversary of the Emancipation Proclamation. And because it's a short book (only 111 pages), they are recommending a second short book, *Between the World and Me*, by Ta-Nehisi Coates, written as a letter to his son. Baldwin's book is a classic among African American literature. Coates's book was the winner of the National Book Award.

**The challenge** is to read one or both books during Black History Month (February) and then join us for a discussion in the fellowship hall of Richmond's First Baptist Church on Monday evening, March 4, from 7:00 to 8:30 pm. These intimate, personal letters will move you, teach you, and make you eager to hear what others have to say. The discussion is free and open to the public. No reservation is required. # IRS MILEAGE UPDATE

WASHINGTON — The Internal Revenue Service today issued the 2024 optional standard mileage rates used to calculate the deductible costs of operating an automobile for business, charitable, medical or moving purposes.

Beginning on Jan. 1, 2024, the standard mileage rates for the use of a car (also vans, pickups or panel trucks) will be:

- 67 cents per mile driven for business use, up 1.5 cents from 2023.
- 14 cents per mile driven in service of charitable organizations; the rate is set by statute and remains unchanged from 2023.
